Trailering 101

There have been changes to the license requirements for towing trailers this year. Before discussing the new law requirements, below are some pertinent terms and definitions:

GVW (Gross Vehicle Weight) and **GW** (Gross Weight) are interchangeable terms meaning the actual weight of the vehicle (trailer) and its complete load.

This weight can be determined by loading the horses, tack, feed, and hay etc. into the fully equipped trailer (mats, spare tire, etc.) and taking it to a truck scale to have it weighed. Most gravel yards or truck stops have truck scales.

GVWR (Gross Vehicle Weight Rating) is the value specified by the manufacturer as the recommended maximum loaded weight of a single vehicle.

This includes the unloaded vehicle weight, all fluids, cargo, optional equipment and accessories.

For a trailer this value is determined by the axle capacity and the coupler capacity. For example, a trailer will be rated at 5000 lb. GVWR by the manufacturer if it has two 2500 lb. axles and a 2 inch ball coupler that is rated 5000 lbs.

Loading the trailer to excess of the GVWR is not only unsafe, but is illegal.

GCVWR (Gross Combined Vehicle Weight Rating) is the value specified by the manufacturer as the recommended maximum loaded weight of a combination of vehicles. The GVWR of the tow vehicle plus the GVWR of the trailer.

In the absence of a value specified by the manufacturer, GCVWR will be determined by adding the GVWR of the power unit and the total weight of the towed unit and any load thereon.

Where do you find a vehicle's weight rating? Every truck and trailer should have a label either inside the door of the truck or attached to the outside of the trailer that gives the vehicle's Gross weight (unladen) and the vehicle's GVWR (fully loaded).

License Requirements

Most people have a basic Class C license. That license used to allow most drivers to haul their horses for recreational purposes. The question is when are you required to get a Class A license to haul your horses?

At a meeting of the Backcountry Horsemen's of California, Officers Chris Kelly and Deron Nelson of the California Highway Patrol addressed this question. Below are the officer's comments from that meeting:

You are required to possess a Class A License under the following conditions:

- You are towing any trailer over 10,000 pounds GVWR, not used for hire, or
- You are towing any fifth-wheel travel trailer over 15,000 GVWR, not used for hire.

The officers stressed that the vehicle's GVWR is the key factor for determining licensing requirements. If no tag exists, an officer may decide to take you to a scale house.

During the meeting, it was also conveyed that if you are operating out of class and stopped for any reason, an officer could write a citation and let you go, you could be parked until someone with a proper class of license arrives to move the vehicle, or your vehicle could be towed.

The officers went on to say that if you're involved in an accident while operating out of class, your insurance company could refuse to pay a resulting claim and/or cancel your policy.

Officers Kelly and Nelson stated that the CHP doesn't enforce the DMV handbook. They enforce California state law.

When concluding, both officers agreed that drivers hauling livestock are some of the safest on the road. Typically, these drivers obey the speed limits and really take their time. They felt that recreational horse owners were some of the best drivers around, but they must be aware of the new license requirements to stay legal.

4th of July Ride

Did you see Norco's 4th of July celebration on the news? Just google "4th of july ride abc" and you can see a short video of Norco pride.

NHA did their part by leading the annual 4th of July ride. Special thanks to Bonnie for not only leading the ride but also choosing the route. Bonnie always does such a great job. She always tries to pick a trail that will keep us cool. This year we had two river crossings and lots of shade.

Thank you to our outriders, Joy Chase, Sharon Chandler, Mindy Green, Bob & Karen Leonard, Elodie Moore, and Bill Naylor.

At the June meeting, Joy challenged everyone to decorate their horses. She did her best. She hopes that next year, all of you will join her in the festivities.
