OCTOBER MEETING

Our October meeting was dedicated to an update on the 420 acres in Norco that we call the Wyle property. Mr. Greg Lansing, the owner of the property, was our speaker and presented 2 possible ideas for the property and is also open to other suggestions.

One idea is to have a hotel and some small industrial buildings. The other idea is to have a hotel and some senior housing that would include a stable for people to board their horses. At this time the zoning for this property would allow the hotel but not the industrial project or the housing. Also, there is still some clean up going on from the contamination caused while the Wyle Company was using the property. Wyle is still paying for a company to monitor the contamination and work on removing any remaining contamination.

We will be following this project and keep our members informed as it progresses through the process toward development.

STATE OF THE CITY 2025



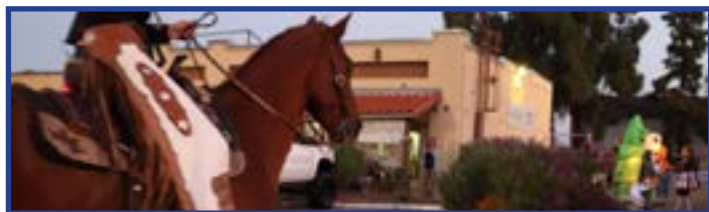


NHA ELECTIONS
